"...just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." –Romans 6:4 ESV

One year I received an email on Maundy Thursday from the Guided Meditation site that came with this heading: "Here is your special Easter Discount coupon." The body of the email said this: "We wish you a very happy and of course relaxing Easter! Hopefully you will have some time to simply relax and enjoy your long weekend. If you are finding it difficult to unwind, maybe try a guided meditation or soothing meditation music to ease you into a more relaxed mindset. As a subscriber of The Guided Meditation Site, we are pleased to give you a 'Special Easter Discount' coupon. All you have to do is enter 'EASTER' in the coupon section of your shopping cart to receive a 20% discount on all of our products! Happy Easter!"

Well, I'm not sure I approve of using Easter as a marketing ploy to sell guided meditations— especially when Easter was only referred to as a "long weekend" during which it may be difficult to unwind. The ad struck me wrong, and I found myself thinking "Who gets Easter?" and I mean that in two ways: who "gets" Easter as in who understands it, who grasps the fullness of its message...and I also mean it in the sense of who "owns" it. Who gets to define Easter? Who gets to control its meaning, and who gets to use it for their own purposes?

Do companies like Paas and Peeps and Cadbury and all the other businesses that trade on the Easter business "get" Easter? Do they get to tell us what Easter means, that Easter is pastel colors and sugary sweetness?

Do families "get" Easter? Do family get-togethers and large family dinners encapsulate the meaning of Easter? Is everything else about Easter a subplot supporting the <u>main</u> plot of getting the brood together to share family time on a long weekend?

Do the skeptics and scoffers "get" Easter? There are atheists who dismiss the entire story as a nonsensical imaginary tale...and neo-pagans are quick to remind us that Easter is actually about Ishtar, the goddess of fertility, and that Christians appropriated a lovely pagan festival for their own celebration! Do non–Christians get Easter? Do they get to tell us what it means, and how—or if—we are to even honor it?

Does the Christian religion "get" Easter? From time to time we hear about riots in Jerusalem at the church of the Holy Sepulcher, as fellow Christians protest and turn violent over who gets to claim that Easter space as their own. What an astonishing way to "get" a holy day that honors the one who gave his disciples a new commandment to love one another, so that everyone would know we are his disciples...by our love!

And do individual Christians "get" Easter? Yes, it's our holiday, so we "get" it...it is ours to observe and celebrate. But do we as Christians really *get* it? In the sense of understanding its mystery, its importance, its good news? That's a little harder to answer, isn't it? I'm a Christian—or at least I think I am...and I'm not sure I *get* Easter. When it comes to Easter, I've been all over the map. As a child I was mesmerized as I heard the story with an accepting, uncritical mind. I've been a skeptic, not sure if it's really possible for this story to be literally true. I've been a doubting Thomas—a lot! Unless I see those nail holes and the gaping wound in his side—I will not believe. I've been perplexed and confused...I want to believe, but I'm not sure what Jesus rising from the dead really means. Does it mean I'm saved? Does it mean that the world has changed? Will I rise from the dead on the great day of judgment—is that the hope? Or am I missing something else? Does Easter mean something more?

Well, fellow Christians, we "get" Easter—It's our holiday, it's our "holy day" to celebrate however we see fit...

And we "get" Easter whether we *get* it or not, whether we understand it or not, and believe it or not. When you think about it, Jesus gave us quite a gift, this Easter business! Although it's really more of a *puzzle* than a gift. But maybe that *is* its gift...Easter as a puzzle.

That way we get to wrestle with Easter like Jacob wrestled with that angel and ended up with the new name "Isra-EI," which means "God- wrestler." We get to try to figure out how it is good news that a good man was killed by jealous, confused and frightened people, sealed in a tomb...and then came out alive on the third day.

Now we get why he was killed. That's what the world does to good men like Jesus-nothing new there. But why did he come back? Why, even after he said "it is finished"...why wasn't he finished with *us*? Now I know we have church answers to that question. We all been told what Easter means—at least once a year. But what does it mean that a man would love you so much that he would be willing to *die* to help you...and then be willing to come back to life to *continue* helping you?

What does it mean that a man would be literally tortured to death, yet even while he was suffering in anguish he prayed "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do?" He wasn't just praying for his torturers. Wasn't he also praying for all of us who go about our lives bungling things up, hurting others, wasting our lives, wasting opportunities to be loving, helpful people.... because we know not what we do?

What does it mean that someone who *loved* like Jesus loved was raised from the dead, and is now exalted to the right hand of God? Does it mean that the kind of love Jesus embodied is of supreme importance? Does it mean that we need to take love more seriously, and work at it more intentionally? Does it mean we need to surrender to it more completely, and let it change everything about us?

And what does it mean that Easter is a sign of new life, and new beginnings? That Easter is Jesus' testimony on behalf of God, who wants us to resurrect to new lives, too? Does Easter mean setting aside our bitterness, our angriness, our pessimism, our despair, our aimlessness and our hopelessness so we can live the lives we were created to live? So we can come out of the tombs we have been living in, and resurrect to blessed and holy and empowered and loving lives?

So what *does* Easter mean to you? How do you "get" Easter? And what will you do with it—this year, and next year, and the year after that?

Friends, Holy Week is upon us once again, and my prayer for us all is that this year we all "get" Easter a little more; a little deeper; with a little more joy than we ever have before! And I pray that the power of God, which filled a crucified, dead and buried man 2000 years ago and brought him out of a tomb to a new life...

Will fill each of *us* with new life! And not just on Easter Day, but every day! Happy Easter! –Pastor Craig

#### Palm Sunday April 2 10 a.m.

April 2 is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. Join us in worship as we remember Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem and prepare our hearts and minds for his passion, crucifixion, and resurrection. Although it is the first Sunday of the month, the sacrament of Holy Communion will not be offered at this service.

### Maundy Thursday Evening Service April 6, 6 p.m.

We will observe Maundy Thursday with a service of worship beginning at 6 pm in the East Chapel. We will reflect together on the meaning of this night, and share the sacrament of Holy Communion.

#### Easter Activities Sunday, April 9

Easter is the pinnacle of the Christian faith, the day of our greatest celebration as Jesus "conquers sin and death, and reconciles the world to himself." Join us as we begin our Easter celebration at First Congregational with a festive Easter Breakfast, starting at 9:00 a.m. in Fellowship Hall, provided by the Christian Education board. There will be a free-will offering that will benefit our Christian Education program. There will be no Adult Education class that day. At 10:30 a.m. (please note the time change) we will gather in the sanctuary for our Easter Worship service, which will include the sacrament of Holy Communion. There will be no coffee after worship that day.

#### **Easter Flowers**

The Chancel Committee invites you to share your favorite flowering plant with the congregation for the Easter service. If you wish to participate, please have your flower(s) at the church by 4pm on Saturday, April 8. You may take your flowers with you following the Easter service, Sunday, April 9. Please let Michele know if your flower is in memory or honor of someone by April 5.

There are many Spring plants traditionally associated with the Easter Season. This is a list of some of them, along with the symbolism behind them.

Azaleas are interpreted as having many different meanings, but the most relevant Easter meaning is, "caring for the family and self."

Daffodils, along with other floral bulbs, are symbolic of rebirth and new beginnings. These are also known as "Lent lilies" in England because of their long association with Lent.

Daisies symbolize purity, innocence, gentility and loyalty.

Easter Cactus symbolizes rebirth.

**Easter Lilies** are symbolic of purity, virtue, innocence, hope and life, which makes them the go-to flower of Easter.

Hyacinth - in the language of flowers, the purple hyacinths mean you are seeking forgiveness, blue hyacinths are tied to sincere care or constancy, and pink hyacinths symbolize joy, playfulness and fresh starts.

Tulips seem to come back from the dead, which is one reason they are associated with

Easter. They have a unique bell-shaped blossom that resembles the spherical shape of an Easter egg.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by the Moderator, Wil Groves in Fellowship Hall. Pastor Craig opened the meeting with a prayer. The February minutes were approved as written.

**Board and Committee Summaries:** 

**Treasurer's Report:** The February offerings were \$12,445.00 and expenses were \$14,443.53. Expenses outweigh offerings for the month. Because offerings exceeded expenses for the previous two months, the offerings to date still exceed expenses to date. So far March offerings are not looking good. Tracy Wehrhan moved and Cindy Henning seconded a motion that the report be put to audit. The motion passed. Finance Board: The Finance Board members have not met. Scholarships will be on their next agenda. Christian Education: There will be no KLAB for two weeks and possibly not on the 23rd either due to a conference. Easter breakfast will be served on April 9th beginning at 9am in Fellowship Hall. Quiche, egg dishes and pastries are on the menu. Mission: Souper Bowl supper raised \$271 in January. The collection for Funding Future Leaders was \$1210. OGHS offering will be taken March 19th. The D/SAOC auction is online from March 30 through April 4th. Items are being collected for an Easter basket for pets. A climate change display will be up soon in Fellowship Hall. Offerings for Earthquake emergency relief fund were taken through February. Jose will report about cobalt mining in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Staff/Parish: The committee met to establish meeting times and assign folks to contact church employees. Trustees: The wiring (guts) for the electrical panel (which is here) were shipped vesterday. A concern was brought up about the outside light above the west entrance. It does not seem to be working. Women's Fellowship: Lenten Lunch is on Tuesday, March 28 from noon to 1pm at Faith United Methodist for \$10.00. The "SERVV" sale is underway. A catalog is in Fellowship Hall. Orders will be done online. Thrift Sale is April 21st from 10am to 6pm. Watch for a sign-up sheet. The Constitution and By-Laws for Women's Fellowship are being reviewed and possibly revised. Circles will review it and then vote on it during the May dinner which will be Thursday, May 25 at 5:30 to 6:30. A taco bar with root beer floats will be served. Worship: First meeting was March 3rd. There will be no communion on Palm Sunday. There will be communion on Maundy Thursday and on Easter Sunday, Regan Ray McCarville will be baptized on March 19th, Pastor's Report: Pastor Craig will be gone on March 26th. Marjorie will lead the service. Easter Sunday is April 9th and there will be a breakfast served at 9am. Shrove Tuesday pancake supper was a success with more than 40 people enjoying the pancake bar. KLAB will not meet for at least 2 weeks. The adult Sunday school topic of LGBTQ is ongoing. The Tri-Conference is still looking for 10 Conference Deacons. WC financial institutions are doing a food pantry drive in March with proceeds going to local food pantries. The summer lunch program is still be considered by the school system as to whether is will happen this summer. EHNC approved 5 applications in February for a total of \$1800.00. The 'Jesus Revolution' movie will be at WC Theater March 17 – 23. There will be discounted admission for youth groups on a special night. Other churches are welcome to attend.

#### **New Business:**

The A.S.K. Program is a new congregational discernment program designed to assist churches with a revitalization process. This is a 3-month congregational discernment program guided by Rev. Congregations that will significantly benefit from ASK have these characteristics:1) Will commit to the program for a concentrated 3 months. 2) Church has general cohesion and not significantly conflicted. 3) Has a willingness and openness to consider a wide range of possibilities.4) Will form a discernment team of 4-6 people that will work to lead and engage the congregation through the program.

**WCMA:** The women's annual Lenten Luncheon will be held at Faith UMC on March 28, noon-1 pm, cost: \$10. We continue to discuss how to respond with emergency relief to local individuals and families experiencing a crisis like a housefire, and we will have a Red Cross rep at our next meeting to discuss their disaster response protocols. There is a discussion about holding another "Faith at the Fair" church service during the Hamilton County fair on July 30, 9:30 a.m. Asbury is sponsoring another food packing event "Meals for the Heartland" on Sept 16. WC financial institutions are doing a collective food pantry drive in March; proceeds go to local food pantries. The school system is weighing if they will have another summer lunch program. If so, they will ask for help from churches as before. If they will not hold the program, then the WCMA is likely going to provide our own program like last year. EHNC had 5 applications in February, 3 were approved for \$1800 in disbursements.
